Ko ēnei tikanga kākahu i ahu mai ai i ngā whānau o TKKM o Te Whānau Tahī , hei ārahi i a mātou kia pai ai tā te ākongā mau i ngā kākahu kura i runga i te mea, he tohu tērā o ngā uara, me ngā whakatutukitanga o tēnei hāpori.

The TKKM o Te Whānau Tahī kura uniform was designed by the kura whānau and should be worn with pride as those who wear it represent the values, collective vision and achievements of our kura community.

Ko ēnei ngā tikanga kākahu | The correct uniform consists of:

Kura Tuatahi: Year 1 to Year 8

Scarves and warm hats in winter are optional, plain red, black or white are preferred.

Kura Tuarua: Year 9 to 13

Scarves and warm hats in winter are optional, plain red, black or white are preferred.

Me mau ngā kākahu kura e ngā ākonga i te wā e tū ana rātou hei māngai o te kura, ahakoa te kaupapa.

The correct kura uniform should be worn by students at all times when at kura or representing the kura in a formal capacity.

Me mā tōna āhuatanga, kia tere hoki te whakatika i ngā hōhaha.

It should be kept clean and tidy, with any rips or tears repaired as soon as possible.

Ko te hiahia kia whai ngā ākonga i ētahi atu kākahu tuarua, mēnā e tākaro hākinakina ana.

It is recommended that students have a change of clothing for sports activities.

Ka whakaaetia ngā whakarākei, engari kia kotahi te whakarākei taringa ki ia taringa, tētahi matawā, me ngā taonga Māori. Ki te pakaru / ngaro / whati / te taonga, nō te tamaiti te hē, ehara nō Te Whānau Tahi.

Jewellery may be worn but is limited to single small earrings, a watch and taonga Māori. Students are responsible for looking after their taonga. Te Whānau Tahi does not take responsibility for taonga that are lost, damaged or stolen.

Me māori te tae o ngā makawe. Ka whakaaetia ngā waitae, engari me māori te kitenga atu. Ko ngā pāhau, kia kaua e tiwekaweka te āhua.

Hair colours should be naturally occurring. Hair dye can be used, however it needs to be a natural looking colour. Facial hair needs to be tidy. Long hair should be tied up/back.

Me tuhi ngā ingoa ki ngā kākahu, ā, kia rite tonu te tiro i ngā ingoa, nā te mea ka mimiti haere te tā i te wā e horoia ai. Ka waiho ngā kākahu ki te Paekura, tae noa ki te mutunga o te wāhanga. Ka whakahokia ngā kākahu mehemea he ingoa kua tuahia, ki te kore, ka tukuna ki te hunga e pīranga ana kia whai kākahu.

All uniform items should be clearly named - please check regularly as names that are written in ink can wear off due to washing. Lost property is kept in the tari until the end of term - named items will be returned to students and those that are un-named will be given to students in need of uniform.

Mō te tūpono ka hia tautoko ngā whānau ki te hoko i ētahi kākahu, ka whakaritea tētahi tikanga e te tari, e tētahi Kaitoko i te Ora rānei.

In the event that whānau need support to purchase the correct uniform items arrangements can be made through the tari or kura Social Worker.
